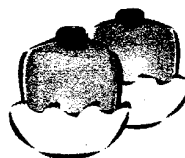

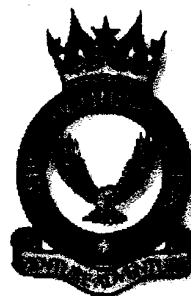

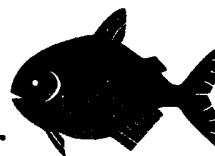

'I know a bank' - April 2002 article for the Alyth Voice by Paul Ramsay.

Which is the Sherlock Holmes story in which Holmes and Watson make an urgent journey by train into the country, in desperate haste to prevent some dreadful crime? As the train rolls through the peaceful rural landscape Watson exclaims on the calm beauty that he sees around him. By way of reply, and looking through the window with a sardonic eye, Holmes declares that beneath its apparent peace the countryside is the scene of the most dreadful deeds.

Darwin seems to take a similar line in a well-known passage in the 'Origin of Species', where he comments on the 'plants and bushes clothing an entangled bank' and then describes the struggle beneath the apparent calm. In fact it is probably the other way round. I should think that Conan Doyle was familiar with the writings of Charles Darwin. And was Darwin himself thinking about that speech in 'A Midsummer's Night's Dream', but putting his own gloss on it?

*'I know a bank whereon the wild thyme blows,
Where oxlips and the nodding violet grow
Quite over-canopied with luscious woodbine,
With sweet musk-roses, and with eglantine..'*

These were some of thoughts about the diversity of approaches to nature that ran through my mind as I stood in the Wet Wood at dusk recently.

With every day that passes spring comes a little closer. Hearing the cry of an oyster-catcher at half past three on a windy night a week or two ago told me that they are back here at Bamff again for the breeding season.

The name is one of those curious misnomers: oystercatchers do not catch oysters, but catch and eat cockles, mussels and a whole lot of other things, including earthworms. One hundred years ago you would have been lucky to see them breeding inland, except on the shingle banks of the larger rivers, but it seems that they learned to eat earthworms after the harsh winters of 1947, 1955 and 1963 reduced the availability of cockles on sea shores, and moved inland to breed in numbers.

Springtime brings work. The projects over which one ruminated through the winter must now be carried out. Tools last seen the previous spring have to be found. Emails arrive from tree nurseries, asking when last autumn's orders may be delivered, and I realise suddenly that I have not been in touch with the contractor who, I hope, will come and plant the trees in my latest plantation. And what about that arrangement for wild boar to come and turn over ground that is destined for the natural regeneration of woodland? I have already begun to plant willow whips here and there along the burn sides. A few years ago I entered the Countryside Premium Scheme. One of the things that was promoted under this agri-environment scheme was the protection of water margins: the edges of burns, ponds, lochs. I liked the idea and had some hundreds of metres of

fencing erected to protect burn and ditch sides from livestock. Since then these fenced off bits of ground have looked rather bare to me, forlorn with their overgrown grasses and without a regeneration of scrub and flowering plants yet, though of benefit to the voles and thus to owls and kestrels. The thing is to go about and find a promising willow, cut a branch or two with plenty of young, well budded shoots, cut these into whips and set off and stick them in the ground. I like this way of planting trees. It has the merit of being free, from the point of view of the stock, and a bit haphazard, but it would be no good as a way of covering a large area with trees speedily. I have always been a bit hazy about the identification of willows, but the local natives are grey willow and eared willow, and it is from these that I draw for my riparian strips.

As I walk about planting these willows I witness the hidden life of the countryside. Disturbed, a snipe rises from the ground and zig-zags away crying 'grit,grit!' Time passes. In the distance a long-eared owl hoots and from time to time the more familiar cries of the tawny owls come clearly through the twilight. A rabbit screams as it meets its death: stoat, fox, or owl? Pheasants go to roost in the trees and I begin to wonder about human companionship, the warm kitchen and jolly television that await me at home.

'Splosh!' What was that then? What would Holmes have said?

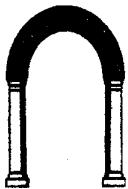
